3. Baptisms and Confirmations

6.1 Christ Church Pokhara

The construction of a temporary church building has been completed and dedication was done on 18th of November 2023. Rev Kancho has been posted to Christ Church Pokhara as the permanent clergy.

6.2 Redevelopment Project & Fund Raising

By God's Grace we have paid all the final payments to the architect, conductors, and vendors. The outstanding loan amount as of 31st of December 2023 to the Diocese is \$600,150.

7. Parish Level Events

7.1 Church Camp

Church Camp was held from 5th to 7th June at Lotus Resort, Desaru. 128 members across all services attended the Camp which was truly a blessing to the participants. Mr. James Singh was the Camp speaker.

7.2 Parish Revival Meeting

Parish Revival meetings were held on August 11th to 13th, 2023 with the theme "Church & Missions". The special speaker was Rev Kalyan Kumar from Chennai who discussed the challenges and opportunities in Missions. All messages were given in Tamil and English for the benefit of members from the six services.

7.3 Gospel Meeting

Punjabi Gospel meetings were held from 22nd to 24th September 2024. The speaker was Pastor Amrit Sandhu from Punjab, and he was accompanied by Gospel singer Bro. Mark Tribhuvan. About 600 people attended the Gospel rally, out of which 82 were newcomers.

7.4 Parish Leaders Meetings

Parish Leaders Retreat were held on 6th of May, 19th of August and 18th of November. Bro Mohan from PDJ led the discussion on the topic "Culture and Change". Leaders did an assessment and identified the five Dysfunctions of a Team. Pastoral team discussed about these 5 Dysfunctions and came up with the recommendation to fix these Dysfunctions.

Leaders met on 18th November 2023 to discuss and confirm the calendar of events for 2024.

7.5 Foundation Day Service

Christ Church's 83^{rd} Foundation Day was celebrated with a service of thanksgiving and rededication on the 22^{nd} of October 2023 at 6.00PM in Christ Church sanctuary. Members from all the services participated in the service. Rev. Dr Joshua Sudharman brought God's Word. The service was followed by a fellowship dinner.

A total of about 400 new Tamil migrant workers attended these programs.

PUNJABI SERVICE

OUR VISION

To be a redeemed community that is grounded in God's Word, empowered by the power of the Holy Spirit for sanctification, growing in Christ to reach out to the unreached for the glory of God.

OUR MINISTRY

The Punjabi congregation focuses on reaching out to the North Indian community in Singapore and beyond for soul winning. This is achieved by leveraging on telecommuting platforms for our weekly Prayer meetings as well as regular Sunday Services.

POINTS FOR PRAISE

- We thank Almighty God for the baptism of 20 candidates in the month of February, April, and September 2023.
- We thank Almighty God for the confirmation of 37 candidates on 28th May 2023.
- We thank Almighty God for the successful organization of our annual Punjabi congregation picnic on 30th April 2023, this initiative was led by the Youths of the Punjabi Service. The purpose was for sisters and brothers to invite their friends so that they will know about our existence as a worship service reaching out to north Indians. We had a total 135 attendees of newcomers and our church members.
- Two days Gospel Meeting was planned on the 23rd and 24th September 2024. The meeting speaker was by Pastor Amrit Sandhu who is the Senior Pastor of "THE CHURCH OF SALVATION, HEALING AND PROPHECY", under the banner of Amrit Sandhu ministries. His ministry is one of the top 5 largest churches in Punjab India with a regular attendance of 5000 worshippers every Sunday. Beside him, we also invited Bro Mark Tribhuvan from Mumbai as a guest gospel singer to accompany Pastor Amrit Sandhu. Bro Mark is an anointed regular guest worship leader in Amrit Sandhu Ministries. We had a total of 82 newcomers over the 2 days of the gospel Meeting. We praise God for his guidance and anointing on that day, as we have never seen such a big crowd of 518 people on Sunday afternoon. The move of the Holy Spirit was so powerful and we could feel the presence of the Lord in a tangible way as many people were set free from bondages, and also received healing and deliverance.
- We thank Almighty God for our carolling rounds held on 22nd December 2023 and the overwhelming response from the congregation members.
- We thank God for the opportunity to equip the volunteers and organized the 2 pm healing and deliverance prayer.
- We raised more singers for the Punjabi service and 2 pm healing and deliverance prayer.
- Daily prayer groups that are run by ministry leaders who are identified by the pastor.
- We have successfully completed a bible study series on the abundant life for new believers.
- We also participated in church camp, fundraising, and other parish-level events.
- Two of our young adults began representing the Punjabi Service at Parish level committees.

INDIAN TAMIL FRIENDS MINISTRY

"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." - Matthew 28:19-20

Introduction:

We praise, thank, and give glory to our Lord Almighty for his abundant blessings till today in this ministry. We thank our Lord for His grace and guidance for this ministry as IFTM has completed 24 years and marching on successfully. This ministry was started by a few brothers in February 2000, with only 5 IFTM members attending then and as our God is a faithful God, an average of 150 - 170 people, including some nurses and few families, were attending the Sunday services in 2019. During COVID19 shutdown, we started conducting the Sunday Services through Zoom from July 2020 which was attended by an average of 45, including the IFTM brothers staying locally in Singapore, nurses, few families and some IFTM brothers (those who gone back to India) joining from India. As the Covid restrictions eased, the IFTM onsite services commenced from 19th April 2022 and currently, an average of 70 to 80 people attending the onsite services. The Word of God is shared by Pastor. Theodore Samraj, Rev. Paul Xavier, Bro. Kalaikumar and Bro. Thomas Jeyaseelan.

Praise GOD for His grace, mercy, protection and provision for all the brothers who attend our Sunday 7.00 PM service. Praise GOD for new volunteers joining this ministry. Praise God for helping us to start a new weekly prayer fellowship at Woodlands since October'23. Praise God for a baptism in April'23.

Ministry Activities & Events:

- Onsite weekly prayer fellowship in Tuas Avenue 1&14, Penjuru, Jalan Papan, Toh Guan and Woodlands.
- Provide psychological counselling or necessary support to the brothers who lost their loved ones, who are not able to visit India because of various reasons and who has family/personal issues.
- IFTM Picnic and outreach program on 1st May'23.
- Fasting prayer was held on 2nd June 2023.
- Conducted Christmas outreach programs in Penjuru (25th November), Tuas (2nd December) and Woodlands (9th December). It was well attended by 550 Indian migrant brothers. We conducted games, congregational singing, quiz, gave away prizes for winners, distributed food and goody bags along with sharing the gospel.

Site Ministry:

Site Visits: We thank God for His immense grace in helping us to conduct our weekly prayer meetings. The weekly prayer meetings were conducted on Tuesdays for Tuas site (Tuas Avenue 1 / 14), Wednesdays for Penjuru / Jalan Papan site, Thursdays for Toh Guan site and alternate Saturdays for Woodlands. An average of 6-12 brothers joins these onsite prayer meetings. We start with informal chat before leading the brothers in a time of prayer, singing, testimony sharing and sharing the Word of God. We also encourage the brothers to invite their friends to this prayer meetings.

- Deanery of Nepal: We thank God for our Home-grown missionaries to Nepal, Bro Bose and Sis Vasanthi. Their work has been phenomenal in spearheading many church planting and building projects, establishing the Joy Land Kindergarten(JLK), and supporting may other development projects through the Deanery of Nepal including the JLK project at Ranipauwa. We also built a Church Structure for Christ Church Pokhara at Nayabazaar and worship services have started from the new place from Nov-2023. We thank teachers from our Church, Mrs Lily Theodore, Mrs Linda Prem, Mrs Jenifer Sundar who conducted zoom trainings to Balmandir community school at Pokhara. Attached separately is a short report of the work done in Nepal.
- India: We continue to support 10 missionaries and 20 orphan children, through various mission organisations in India. Thanks to our MFC members who have been diligent in supporting this ministry. We also supported Harvest Ministries, Bihar by building a Church hall at Kaniyabad Village, an unchurched village in Kishanganj District, Bihar. More than 70 people are now attending the weekly worship gathering. As a base, they are reaching out to another five neighbouring villages from here.
- Myanmar: We support Pastor Paulson, Peniel Faith Missions in Myanmar monthly and also supported PFM in holding a Gospel rally at one village during the Christmas season, which was attended by about 250 people.
- Others: Other overseas support included one-time support for 2 Tamil Missionaries in Ethiopia and towards the deficit in the annual operating expenses for the Deanery of Laos.

Local Evangelism and Community Service

- Parish Day and Christmas outreach: Parish Christmas outreach was held on 16 Dec and was attended by individuals and families from Pek Kio and SINDA. Support was also extended to IFTM Christmas outreach at Penjuru, Tuas, Woodlands and Church which was attended by over 450 brothers.

Areas where we can actively contribute were laid out and personal testimonies were shared by IFTM brothers and PFS volunteers. Many have step forward to serve as volunteers for these 2 ministries.
- Church: We continue to support IFTM and Punjabi Services where we continue to see many new migrant and domestic workers joining the services every week.
- Others: Hospitality Team was formed, and members were trained by Rev Paul to effectively welcome and engage newcomers. Welcome gifts were prepared and distributed to visitors across services during Dec 2023.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our Vision

The Community Service committee is currently under the umbrella or the Missions and Evangelism committee.

Its objective is to focus on the local mission work(s) and outreach - to focus on the needs of the community and to consider ways in which the church can be a part of this.

The Community Service committee partners with various agencies such as the Singapore Anglican Community Services, Prison Fellowship Singapore (PFS), the Singapore Indian Development Association (SINDA) and the Pek Kio CC, amongst other organizations.

Points of Praise:

Many of our members are serving as volunteers in PFS - specifically in the Family Care ministry, Care Club for Kids, and the In-Care ministry. In the year 2023, again, we supported the Angel Tree project, headed by the PFS, and 25 vouchers were delivered to families by our volunteers. In addition, we also encouraged 30 children of inmates, who are part of the Care Club, by giving them POPULAR bookstore vouchers over the Christmas season.

In December of 2023, we were once again able to partner with Pek Kio Community Centre to bless the residents.

On the 16th of Dec 2023, we had a Parish Christmas outreach program titled "Reason for this Season". We had residents from Pek Kio, who were accompanied by volunteers from the CC, come for the event. We were able to bless the Pek Kio residents and two Indian families from SINDA with a total of 42 hampers, kindly sponsored by various members from our parish. Subsequently, we had more requests from SINDA for hampers, which were delivered to the homes of identified families/individuals. The remaining 49 hampers were given to identified members within our Parish, to a few one-room rental flat residents in Toa Payoh, and the rest were given to Pek Kio CC.

We want to thank the volunteers from all the various services who came together for the hamper packing, on the 14th of December 2023.

We were also able to kick start our tuition intensive program in the month of September 2023 for the PSLE students. We had 10 students who attended the program. There was a mix of students from our own parish, some of their invited friends, and some from PFS. The subjects that were taught are English, Maths, Science and Tamil.

At the end of the program, an art activity was conducted with a motivational talk by Sister Lily Theodore. Vicar also gave a short message and prayed for the students. A motivational kit was also sponsored by Sis Amutha Christopher and Sis Gayathri (8am service) and presented to each child. Lunch was provided for the students and parents.

The overall response from the students and parents was positive. We would like to thank all the teachers and volunteers who came along to assist in the PSLE Intensive program.

On the 30th of November 2023, an appreciation lunch took place for the staff of ST ANDREW'S MIGRANT WORKERS MEDICAL CENTRE. The staff were touched by the Christmas cards, which were crafted by our Sunday school students and teachers. We also had Venerable Wong Tak Meng

share a short devotion before lunch. The objective was to appreciate all of those who served in the SAMWC. The event was very well received and appreciated.

God crossed our paths with a contractor who was able to put up the church structure in a short time. In God's perfect time, mid-November 2023, CCP moved into its new premises. The church is under the leadership of Rev. Kanchho and Sis Sunthali and has home groups, children, youth and women ministries. During the Christmas period, the church conducted carolling in different areas in front of members' homes and special Christmas programmes.

Joy Land Kindergarten, Ranipauwa

God miraculously enabled the completion of the renovations at Ranipauwa and brought new staff for the leadership of the kindergarten. We are assisting in staff training and management in partnership with ACN as the kindergarten moves to its new premises in April 2024, the new academic year. We pray for new enrolment of children and that the kindergarten will win the favour of the community and be a blessing to families.

Other Projects

We praise God for the opportunity to conduct 3-day teacher's training at Pokhara, Kathmandu and Dhading and a children's camp with 100 children in Pokhara. Truly God gave us safe travels and crossed our paths with families who we could encourage and pray for. Many people were blessed at these meetings. We continue to connect with Balmandir community school at Pokhara conducting training via zoom.

We also support the Deanery of Nepal (DON) and Anglican Church of Nepal (ACN), in reaching out to 2 outreach slum centres through training and feed the poor program. Currently, Sunday School is being held for Tamil, Contemporary /Punjabi, English and IFTM/Malayalam services. We have a total of 68 children from the 6 services attending Sunday School weekly and a dedicated, vibrant, and committed team of 23 teachers.

Regular Activities

Ready, Steady, Go! Programme – This programme was introduced to welcome the children for the new year and to establish routines and rules. This allows the teachers to bond with the children under their care, to provide a warm, inclusive, safe and caring environmental culture that promotes children's spiritual growth and development.

Journalling the Word – Sunday School students were each given journals to take down notes and write down memory verses from their Sunday School lessons to encourage good practices.

Teachers Meeting - Sunday School Teachers devotion and monthly meetings were held on the 4th Saturday of each month. Through these face-to-face meetings, teachers were given a platform to highlight issues, provide suggestions for improvements as well as empower each other by taking turns to sharing the word.

Special Programmes

Lent Programme - Sunday School Teachers enacted the important events from the story of cross for the children during lent season.

National Tamil Month Programme - In conjunction with the annual National Tamil month, an event was held on 29 April 2023 to encourage the love of the Tamil Language. 37 children participated, recited bible verses, sang songs and did impersonations of Biblical characters in Tamil.

Church Camp 2023 Programme - Sunday school teachers carried out lessons for children who attended the Church camp in June.

Memory verse recitation – To encourage learning of the Word, children participated in the main service by reciting memory verses during Family Services, which is the 1st Sunday of every month.

Augmented Choir - The SS children participated in POCC's Building fundraising event and Children's Day as members of augmented choir.

Youth and Sunday School Bonding session – This programme was held on 15 July 2023. 45 children participated. The program was aimed at building strong bonds with Youth Fellowship through worship, testimony sharing, a session on challenges using an interactive enactment on Goliath and David, games, and Art Jam to cultivate sense of belonging and mentorship.

Children's Day cum Movie night – This was held on 7 October 2023 with a movie screening on the "Life of Amy Carmichael", along with games, activities and reflections in conjunction with Mission month.

VBS cum EOY – This was held on 23 to 25 Nov 2023 from 8:30 am to 4:00pm. The theme was "Do What's Right". 60 children including 7 new children attended the VBS. Outdoor bonding activities was held in Jacob Ballas and Botanical Gardens. The event wrapped up with children's performance. SS had partnered with Prison Fellowship Singapore (PFS).

Christmas greeting cards – These cards were designed by Sunday school children during the VBS and were presented to St Andrew's Migrant Workers Anglican Medical Centre at Penjuru with Archdeacon for Community Services Venerable Wong Tak Meng,

Year-End Gathering: TFC ended with a Year-End gathering on 28 October 2023 which was attended by 35 Teens and 8 P6 Sunday School. Mrs Serena Ajay shared God's word. Ps. Moses prayed and blessed the 7 Teens who crossed over to Youth Fellowship in 2024. A new initiative, 'Transition into TFC', provided a platform to welcome Primary 6 students from Sunday School who will cross over to the Teens For Christ in 2024. The new initiative helped forge friendships among the Teens and grow in the love of Christ.

YOUTH MINISTRY

Program Schedule

In 2023, the Youth Ministry (YM) conducted weekly sessions every Sunday at 11 am in Room 207 of the Canon Samuel Baboo Block. All youths from Christ Church were invited to participate, with an average attendance ranging from 14 to 20 individuals. The program consistently commenced with a 10-minute praise and worship session, followed by a 50-minute program.

The schedule outline per month is as follows:

Weeks 1 & 3: Bible Study

On the first and third weeks of every month, Pastor Theodore and Sis Lily Theodore facilitated Bible study sessions. These studies delved into the concept of the end times, incorporating the techniques learned in 2022 for effective personal Bible study approaches.

Week 2: Youth-led Biblical Discussion

The youth core team arranged discussions and devotional sessions centred around topics significant to young individuals during the second week of each month. Specific themes covered included "Building Strong Community Bonds" and "Expressing Gratitude to God."

Week 4: Team Building Activity

Every fourth week of the month, various church members organised and facilitated team building activities aimed at fostering trust, relationships, communication, and collaboration among the youth ministry. These sessions, ranging from amazing races to collaborative games, was aimed to unite the youths and strengthen the bonds within the group while enhancing overall unity and cohesion.

Special Programmes:

Youth Day

On July 2, 2023, we had a combined Teens and Youths program. There was a time of games where the teens and youth bonded together, which was followed by worship. Following that, Sis Sheila shared the word. We ended the program with a time of food fellowship.

Sunday School - Youth Bonding

On July 15, 2023, the youth ministry organised a half day program for the Sunday School children. The program started with a time of song and dance followed by a time of sharing, where the children were split into smaller groups and tagged with a youth member. Additionally, a brief art jam session was conducted, along with engaging games for the children, concluding with a shared lunch.

Sexuality Talk

On July 30, 2023, Bro Andrew Ponniah and his team conducted a discussion on sexuality for the youth. The talk centred on the role of Christian youths in navigating the challenges related to LGBT issues in contemporary society. The session also included a Q&A period, allowing the youths to seek clarification of any doubts they may have had.

Parish of the Week

On August 16, 2023, our youths participated in the Parish of the Week run that was organised by the Diocese of Singapore. The youths, together with clergy from the Diocese and other members of the church ran around the church vicinity and took time to pray together for the Church and its vision to build a community of disciples.

SAIB Youth Wing - Amazing Race

On September 2, 2023, our youths participated in an event organised by the SAIB Youth Wing committee. The youths had a great time engaging and having fellowship with youths from the various SAIB churches.

- Pray that more youths will attend and participate in programs that are organised.
